Dr. Frank Kleinhagenbrock — studied modern and medieval history and public law at the University of Tübingen and the University of Edinburgh. He received his doctorate degree at the University of Tübingen. He is the Managing Director of the Research Center of the Commission for Contemporary History in Bonn. The Research Center contains approximately 30,000 publications, primarily on the history of the political Catholicism and Catholic Church in Germany since the beginning of the 19th century. He is the author and editor of several books and many articles regarding German history encompassing an extensive time period, but with a major focus on the 16th and 17th centuries. He is also a private lecturer at the Chair of Modern History at the University of Würzburg. Although he did speak at a conference at the University of Notre Dame three years ago, this will be his first presentations for a genealogical society in either Germany or the U.S. NOTE: His English is very good.
